1. The money spent has improved provision within the school and therefore has long lasting impact on sport within our school. We intend to continue to spend the money next year, in ways which will see sustained improvement for our pupils.
2. Swimming continues to be an area of great importance for our pupils both for the promotion of safety and of health and well-being. We will continue to introduce Y2 to this sport year on year, as well as continuing to provide lessons to all Y5 as part of our usual PE provision.
3. The teachers benefitted greatly from all training and activities, and share in the children's enthusiasm. They have identified that the teaching of gymnastics is an area in need of further training and development, therefore next year we will spend our funding on training teachers to teach indoor gymnastics.
4. With staff knowledge and expertise improved, we will be holding an Olympic Week next year in recognition of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, Brazil, utilising the skills and subject knowledge of all of our staff.
5. A number of children have asked can they have the chance to play in competitive games such as basketball and volleyball, and therefore, as well as our very successful school teams, we will be providing after school clubs to meet their requests.
