Religious Education Guide: Prayers, Saints and Feasts 2019



Dear Parents,

Please use this information as a brief overview of what your child will be learning in Religious Education during this liturgical unit; **Prayers, Saints and Feasts**. This will give you information on scripture covered, as well as all the information and key questions that you need to support your child over the coming weeks.

AT1: Attainment target 1. This is where children learn about religion (knowledge)

AT2: Attainment target 2. This is where children learn from religion (application)

AT3: Attainment target 3: This is where the children analysis and evaluation religious thinking (synthesis)

Reception:

- Read and understand simple sentences from scripture or from their own religious stories
- Share religious stories they have heard and read with others.
- Write simple sentences about religious stories using phrases or words which can be read by themselves and others.
- Answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to religious stories or events.

Key Questions:

Who was Jesus?

What was his Father's house like?

How did Jesus prepare a place for his friends?

How did he teach his friends to pray to God the Father?

What did Mary do for Jesus to help him grow up?

How does Mary help us get to know Jesus?



Year 1 and 2

- Recognise religious beliefs
- Recognise key people in the local, national and global Church
- Describe different roles of some people in the local, national and global Church
- Say what they wonder about
- Ask wondering questions about all of the areas of study and recognize that some questions are difficult to answer

Key Questions:

How do we give praise to God through prayer?

What is a Saint? What are the qualities of those who follow Jesus?

How do we pray at different times of the year?

What are the qualities of those who follow Jesus?

How do the values of the Saints help us to become more like Jesus?

How does the liturgical calendar help us to think about the life and teachings of Jesus?

What does scripture tell us about Mary's relationship with God?

Year 3 and 4

- Retell a narrative that is accurate in its sequence and details and that corresponds to the scripture source used
- Make links between:
 - beliefs & sources, giving reasons for beliefs
 - beliefs & life, giving reasons for actions and choices
- Make links to show how feelings and beliefs affect their behaviour and that of others
 - Use a given source to support a point of view

Key Questions

What are the qualities of those who follow Jesus?

How do the values of the Saints affect our behaviour and that of others?

What reasons are there for the act of forgiveness?

How does prayer deepen our relationship with God?

How does silence help us to listen to God in prayer?

How and when did Jesus pray?

What does prayer in scripture tell us about Jesus' relationship with God?

How are our own and others beliefs shaped through prayer and meditation?



Year 5 and 6

- Show knowledge and understanding of a range of scripture passages that corresponds to the scripture source used.
- Show a knowledge and understanding of:
 - a range of religious beliefs
 - the life and work of key figures in the history of the People of God
- Show understanding of, by making links between beliefs & sources
- *Use sources to support a point of view*
- *Compare their own and other people's responses to questions about each of the areas of study, in relation to questions of meaning and purpose*

Key Questions:

How does the prayer of St. Teresa affect our behaviour and that of others?

What are the links between going on pilgrimage and love and service of God?

What happens during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?

How are people's beliefs guided by the Catholic tradition of pilgrimage?

How does the laying on of hands and the anointing of oil impact on people's lives?
